Chr. Oquist asked everyone to stand for Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chr. Oquist called the regular meeting to order.

Clerk

James Budnick wanted to ask about the Ark Valley Water (Conduit) terms. Mr. Budnick is a local plumber, and he has concerns about the conduit and the fact that the small water companies in the area are being forced to join in. Co. Baldwin and Chr. Oquist addressed his concern. Co. Baldwin stated that, at this point, no terms have been set yet but that because of the Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) levels the companies will be asked to mix with the conduit water to bring the levels into compliance with Colorado Water Protective and Development Association's (CWPDA's). Chr. Oquist mentioned that if the smaller water companies do not join in with the conduit to come into compliance, then the state will make them do it on their own. At this time regulations have yet to be determined. The consensus was that the State would likely determine that. Discussion was held.

Chr. Oquist called for approval of the consent agenda. The agenda includes approval of the minutes from September 22nd, 2025, bills and payroll for September 16th through September 30th, 2025, and the 2026 Approved Holidays. Co. Baldwin motioned to approve the consent agenda. Co. Knabenshue seconded, Motion carried.

Rick Ward, Otero County Veterans Service Officer, presented the Wreaths Across America program. Since 2008 Congress has proclaimed the second Saturday in December, National Wreaths Across America Day. In 2024 there were approximately 2000 wreaths placed on the graves of veterans in Otero County. In Otero wreaths are placed in cemeteries in Cheraw, Timpas, Higbee, La Junta, and Rocky Ford. This year we are also working with the Town of Fowler. VSO Ward is asking the County to support the program by purchasing wreaths this year. The wreaths are \$17.00 each. He also wanted to thank Ms. Schmidt for coming to the Wednesday morning coffee at the Senior Center with the Vets in the area.

Admin. Schmidt presented that the 2026 Budget is complete and is on the County website. The final budget will be approved in December.

Clerk Scott mentioned that the Logic and Accuracy Testing (LAT's) went well. The commissioners have granted permission for the office to be closed to everything but elections on the 4th of November, Election Day.

Co. Knabenshue gave a big welcome to Kaysie, our new Administrator. He attended several meetings, most notable being Colorado Counties Incorporated (CCI) meetings with legislature and renewable energy, budget meetings, and the Colorado Standard Water Board.

Chr. Oquist met with Southeast Colorado Opioid Region (SECOR), the pharmacy board that helps put grants out for use. At present they have about \$875 thousand they are distributing. The Otero County Health Dept. received funds to help continue their after-school program. They work with students on prevention.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT is entered into this / 3 day of Oct, 2025, by and between the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF OTERO COUNTY, COLORADO, hereinafter referred to as "Otero County", and the TOWN OF CHERAW, COLORADO, hereinafter referred to as "Town",

WHEREAS, C.R.S. 29-1-203 authorizes and encourages intergovernmental agreements and contracts for the purpose of governmental entities to cooperate and contract to provide a function, service, or a facility; and

WHEREAS, Colorado law governing intergovernmental agreements further provides that the contracting governments shall enter into a contract which sets forth fully the purposes, powers, rights, obligations, and responsibilities of the contracting parties; and

WHEREAS, Colorado law dealing with intergovernmental agreements provides that the contracts between the governing entities must be authorized by the approval of the legislative body of the entities in question; and

WHEREAS, the parties are desirous of entering into an agreement to provide a cooperative and uniform building inspection program between Otero County and the Town of Cheraw.

NOW, THEREFORE, based upon good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is acknowledged, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. That upon the execution of this Agreement, the office of the Land Use Administrator for Otero County, Colorado, shall provide building inspection services for the Town of Cheraw.
- 2. That any person desirous of engaging in any building construction in the Town of Cheraw shall first be required to obtain a Certificate of Compliance from the Town. Such Certificate of Compliance shall state that the applicant has complied with the Town's rules and regulations concerning water, sewer, public sidewalks, curbs and gutters, pavement, utility requirements, easements, required tap fees and that any other existing and/or proposed on-site improvements are acceptable.
- 3. Such Certificate of Compliance shall also show the existing zoning district in which the building is located, the fire district in which the building is located, the minimum lot area requirements, building height and area requirements, and a statement that the proposed use is in conformance with the current zoning ordinance.
- 4. Accompanying the Certificate of Compliance shall be a copy of an accurate plot plan showing the lot and placement of the building(s) on the lot, such plot plan being drawn to scale, dimensional and having the Town's approval noted on it.

- 5. After the applicant has obtained the Certificate of Compliance from the Town, the applicant shall deliver the Certificate of Compliance and approved plot plan to the Land Use Office located at 411 North Tenth Street, Rocky Ford, CO 81067. The applicant will also be required to furnish to the Building Inspector/Land Use Administrator the appropriate building plans and specifications as required by the last adopted version of the International Building Codes and the Uniform Building Codes, as adopted and amended by the Otero County Board of County Commissioners. The County assumes no responsibility to any part if the Town issues a Certificate of Compliance without the requirements of such Certificate being fulfilled by the applicant.
- 6. Upon completion of the above requirements and upon the approval of the Building Inspector/Land Use Administrator, a building permit will then be issued. The issuance of said permit or approval of plans and specifications shall not be construed to be a permit for or any approval of any violation of any provision of the current adopted and amended International Building Codes and the Uniform Building Codes.
- 7. Upon issuance of a building permit, the Building Inspector/Land Use Administrator shall assume all responsibility for the inspection of such building as is covered within the limitation of the building permit.
- 8. Upon completion of the building, the applicant or his/her Contractor shall inform the Building Inspector/Land Use Administrator that all requirements necessary to obtain a Certificate of Occupancy have been fulfilled. The Building Inspector/Land Use Administrator shall make a final inspection and if all requirements have been met, a Certificate of Occupancy will be issued.
- 9. It is expressly understood between the parties hereto that the Town shall have sole responsibility of ascertaining that all new construction within the Town shall be authorized first by the Certificate of Compliance and then by a building permit issued pursuant to this Agreement before any construction is initiated. In the event such new construction is discovered prior to the Certificate of Compliance and the issuance of a building permit, such construction shall be ordered stopped by the Town until compliance with both has been achieved. The Town shall have the authority to set a fine for such violations and such fines shall be payable to the Town.
- 10. An applicant, upon denial of a Certificate of Compliance by the Town of Cheraw, may appeal such denial to the Town Council pursuant to the procedure set forth in the Town of Cheraw's Zoning Ordinance.
- 11. An applicant, upon denial of a building permit by the Building Inspector/Land Use Administrator, may appeal such denial to the Town Council pursuant to the procedure set forth in the Town of Cheraw's Zoning Ordinance.

- 12. It is further agreed that the Town shall retain all fees as established by Town Ordinance or Resolution and collected by the Town for the issuance of a Certificate of Compliance, and that the County shall retain all building permit fees as established by the Otero County Building Resolution. Said building permit fees shall be paid directly to the County at the time the building permit is issued.
- 13. It is further understood and agreed that this agreement does not waive the requirement of any applicant to obtain any other separate permit as required by law. Such permits include, but are not limited to, plumbing and electrical permits.
- 14. It is further agreed by the parties hereto that this agreement may be amended at any time by the consent of both parties hereto, and that any such amendment shall be in writing and signed by the parties hereto.
- 15. It is further agreed by the parties hereto that this agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. It is expressly understood that any building under construction at such time of termination shall continue to be inspected as prescribed in this agreement.
- 16. This agreement shall be non-assignable by either party without having received the prior written consent of the other party.
- 17. This agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Colorado.
- 18. Upon default by either party, the non-defaulting party shall have available to it any and all remedies which may be available, whether at law or in equity. The non-defaulting party shall be entitled to recover any costs or expenses of any kind, including attorneys' fees, which said party shall incur in enforcing its rights under this agreement.
- 19. The covenants and conditions herein shall be binding upon the successors and assigns in interest of the parties hereto.

WHEREAS, the residents of Otero County have great respect, admiration, and the utmost gratitude for all the men and women who have selflessly served our country and this community in the Armed Forces; and

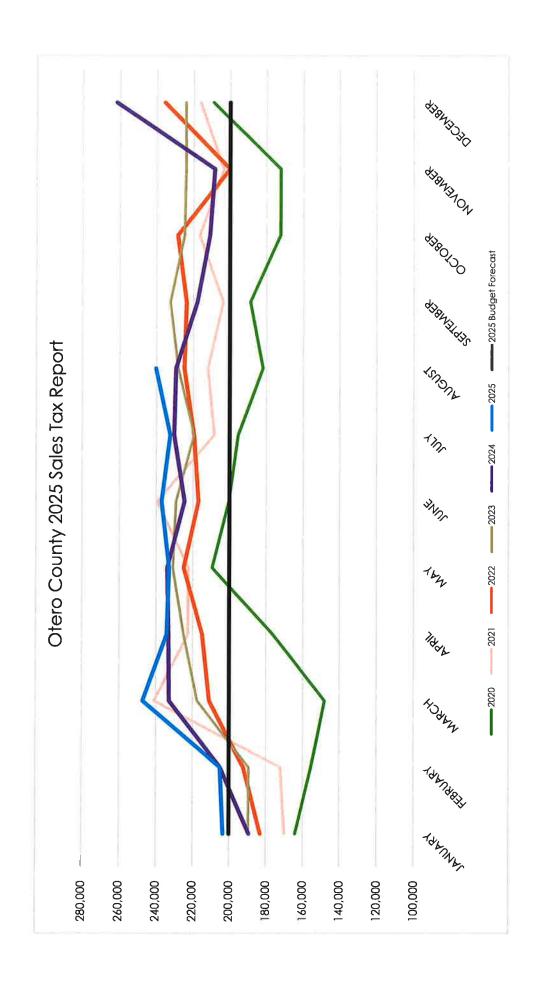
