Chr. Baldwin called the meeting to order and asked for approval of the minutes from March 22nd, 2021. Co. Oquist motioned to approve the minutes. Co. Hostetler seconded. Motion carried.

Michelle Gardner presented an update on the redistricting commission. There will be a public meeting coming soon, she would like to see the commissioners go to all the meetings. There will be 2 separate areas for the commission, one is congressional, and one is legislative. There are 12 people on each of the commissions. The status is delayed due to delays with the census information. The Governor has asked the commissions to move forward with projections, as of now this has not been done. The new process that they are trying to use is to leave out as much political bantering as possible. Discussion was held.

Clerk Scott presented two letters of support for ratification for ERTB grants. The first letter is for \$185,950.00 for ArcaSearch this is a phase 11 project. The second letter is for LEDS to help with our icounty program and replacement of the scanner in the recording room, it is for \$27,736.00. Co. Hostetler motioned to approve the ratification for the ERTB grants. Co. Oquist seconded. Motion carried.

Chr. Baldwin called for the approval of the bills from March 16 to March 31, 2021. Co. Oquist motioned to approve the bills. Co. Hostetler seconded. Motion carried.

Danelle Berg would like to remind everyone about the SEDS development sessions will be on April 29th and May 13th from 6-8pm, please attend both sessions as they work together. Any projects that you want included in this program needs to be listed because if it is not, it will not be included as this is a federal funding program. There is a fillable form on the website that people can fill out and get to her and she will get them where they need to be. There is a new program called Wheels to Work part of the manufacturing partnership for 6-8th graders. Santa Fe BOCES, the Work Force Center, the Generation School, and the Rural Education will be holding a business showcase. The date is May 12th from 8:30 to 12:30 at the Rocky Ford Babcock Park, The Tiger Gym south parking lot and at the Fairgrounds in Rocky Ford. The business should give a presentation on what it would take to work in these occupations.

Lex Nichols presented a revegetation report from Front Range Pipeline on the 1041 permit, the land was disturbed so a revegetation was needed for a 22- mile stretch. The revegetation is good on the north side, but parts are still not done. They are in the 7th year of revegetation because parts of the south side are not doing as well because that is shale. Road and bridge are almost done with bar pitting, hope to be done this week. They will start hot patching and chip sealing the roads in June. There are plans to replace a bridge from the ground up on road 15 next to Sweitzer's property in November.

Co. Hostetler spent time on zoom meetings. The meeting for RESADA was to hire a new Executive Director Steve Martinez, who is replacing Eric Peterson who is retiring.

Co. Oquist has been working with the area dispatchers—traveling to different communication centers—having meetings on how to combine all our communication centers into one and how much it will cost and where it will be.

Chr. Baldwin attended a STAC meeting on zoom. At present there are several projects going on in the area, Hwy 266, bridge on 71 and others. There will be a greenhouse gas meeting on April 23rd @ 11:30am to 1:00pm on zoom, he would recommend that people who are interested in the meeting please sign in to attend.


OTERO COUNTY SALES TAX REPORT February 2021





Resolution #2021 – 05

A RESOLUTION OPPOSING 2022 BALLOT INITIATIVE 16

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2021, a citizens initiative entitled "Protect Animals from Unnecessary Suffering and Exploitation (PAUSE) was approved by the Title Board of the Colorado Secretary of State for petition to the November 2022 General Election as Initiative 16: and

WHEREAS, the initiative will broadly redefine animal sexual abuse in a manner that will criminalize many common and necessary veterinary and animal husbandry practices; and

WHEREAS, the initiative criminalizes the following veterinary and animal husbandry practices: spaying and neutering, reproductive practices (artificial insemination, pregnancy diagnosis, fertility testing) etc.; and

WHEREAS, the initiative will additionally require tremendous delays, in most cases years, prior to the humane harvesting of livestock; and

WHEREAS, these delays (up to one-quarter of an animal's statutorily defined natural lifespan) will greatly increase the costs to livestock producers by forcing the continuation of feeding this livestock past their prime harvest age at which will cause meat of lower quality to be sold to the consumer at much higher purchase prices; and

WHEREAS, these increases in livestock production costs will put Colorado producers at an unfair disadvantage to surrounding states and countries that compete with Colorado producers for the same markets causing many to severely reduce or go out of business; and

WHEREAS, many Colorado farmers sell their crops to these producers but because of the reduction or elimination of these livestock markets, many farmers will also struggle; and

WHEREAS, Initiative 16 is an industry killing effort that will have a disastrous economic impact to farmers, ranchers, meat cutters, veterinarians, and other related industries; and

WHEREAS, the governor's spokeswoman Shelby Wieman said Governor Polis "agrees with farmers and ranchers that the PAUSE ballot initiative would hurt Colorado and destroy jobs, and he opposes it."; and

WHEREAS, this Board detests the infliction of needless suffering of animals and recognizes that our cattle and livestock producers take great effort to treat their animals humanely.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Otero, Colorado, as follows:

- 1. the Board opposes this Initiative 16 and urges the Governor of Colorado and Commissioner of the Colorado Department of Agriculture to continue to do the same; and
- 2. urges all citizens of Otero County to decline to sign any petition that supports placing Initiative 16 (PAUSE) on the November 2022 ballot: and
- 3. that all people that care about the well-being of animals be they livestock, pets, service animals, or other take action to defeat this measure if it does make the November 2022 ballot.
