Guests in attendance were: on phone: Anne Boswell, Marty Lee, Danelle Berg, Cathy Garcia, Dee Leyba, Michelle Griego, Aaron Oliveri and Christian Burney. In person: Rick Ritter.

Chr. Goodwin called the meeting to order and requested approval of the minutes from April 13, 2020. Co. Hostetler motioned to approve the minutes. Co. Baldwin seconded. Motion carried.

In old business: Otero County Clerk Lynda Scott presented the ERTB grant answers to questions that were asked. ArcaSearch will do the hosting on this there will be 2 Removable Hard drives with 2 formats one in a pdf and one in a jpeg. Clerk Scott is asking for signature on the grant. Co. Baldwin approved signature on the grant. Co. Hostetler seconded. Motion carried.

Danny Chavez, Emergency Management presented a Debris Management Regional Plan for debris management and removal of debris after a natural disaster, like a tornado or a flood. This plan will encompass all 6 Counties in our region, those being Otero, Bent, Crowley, Baca, Las Animas and Prowers, and all Counties have to approve the plan. This is a FEMA approved plan on how to dispose of debris and how Counties will be reimbursed for monies spent on clean up. Mr. Chavez is asking for signature on the plan. Co. Hostetler motioned to approve the plan. Co. Baldwin seconded. Motion carried.

Chr. Goodwin called for approval of the bills from April 1st to April 15th. Co. Baldwin motioned to approve the bills. Co. Hostetler seconded. Motion carried.

Admin. White-Tanabe asked Danelle Berg to discuss the IGA for OPI which is an amended/restated IGA between The Otero County Board of Commissioners, The City of La Junta, The City of Rocky Ford, The Town of Cheraw, The Town of Swink, The Town of Manzanola, The Town of Fowler and the Board of Commissioners of Las Animas County. The IGA is being amended/restated to include Las Animas County as a member of OPI. This will also clarify the micro loan approval procedure. Ms. Berg is asking the Board for signature. Co. Hostetler motioned to approve the IGA. Co. Baldwin seconded. Motion carried.

Danny Chavez Emergency Manager reported that there has been a lot of COVID 19 efforts. Attended an Emergency Management conference in February, it was well attended. The quality of the Conference has improved. The landfill has not seen a decrease in services, if anything there has been a slight increase. Working on the revegetation on Site 1. They now use a spray on cover for the landfill instead of dirt, this saves space in the landfill and so it will help with the longevity of the landfill.

Rick Ritter the Health Department Director gave us an update on the COVID 19. Otero County now has 7 confirmed cases. Crowley County has 2 confirmed cases, so our total is now 9. Stats from the 18<sup>th</sup> of April show that State wide we have had 9730 cases, 1813 hospitalized, 56 counties affected, 46,195 people tested, 422 deaths and 111 outbreaks in long term care and assisted health care facilities. Mr. Ritter also wanted to say thank you to Amy and Danny for the great job they are doing.

Danelle Berg reported that she was working with the paycheck protection plan as well as the idle loan. They are working on putting together another round of applications for this protection. OPI has funds available for the micro fund loan. These are small loans from \$1,000.00 to \$10,000.00. The interest rate on the loans is no more than 2 points above prime which is standard. Prime was at 3.25% on Friday.

Co. Hostetler would like to encourage everyone to participate in the Census program.

The question was posed as to whether Otero County Commissioners will send a letter to the Governor like Mesa County did, asking to be released from the stay at home order. Chr. Goodwin said that the Commissioners would not be sending a letter, they would be listening to the Health department for guidance.


