Chr. Goodwin called the meeting to order and requested approval of the minutes from July 20th, 2020. Co. Hostetler

County Assessor Ken Hood presented a Petition for Abatement or Refund of taxes for Keybank National Association. This is a refund of \$7,986.80 because per CRS 39-3-118.7 the Renewable Energy property (personal property) is exempt and there is a solar garden located on the property. Mr. Hood is asking for signature on the refund. Co. Baldwin motioned to approve the refund. Co. Hostetler seconded. Motion carried.

Admin. White-Tanabe presented a letter of support to the Lower Arkansas Valley Water Conservancy District for a grant from WSRF to line part of the Catlin Canal to prevent seepage. The letter is going to the Colorado Water Conservation Board. Admin. White-Tanabe is asking for signature on the letter. Co. Hostetler motioned to approve signature on the letter. Co. Baldwin seconded. Motion carried.

Emergency Manager Danny Chavez reported that after meeting with Sheriff Mobley, the local fire chiefs, it has been determined that due to the amount of rain we've had lately the fire restrictions can be lifted. The fire danger will be monitored to determine when or if the restrictions need to be imposed in the future. Co. Baldwin motioned to lift the ban. Co. Hostetler seconded. Motion carried.

Danelle Berg reported that she had three new business loans through OPI for Las Animas County and Otero County. There are new businesses looking for property or buildings that will work for their needs. She was asked about how she thought the County was doing and she said that she felt it was going well.

Admin. White-Tanabe has been working on the 2021 budget process. She has also been looking at the 2020 budget and how to evaluate the impact that COVID-19 has had as a whole. The new backup generator for the Sheriff's office should be installed by the end of this week. The county is still waiting on the CARES Act to become available.

Co. Hostetler met with Debbie Chapman from the Colorado State University extension service and found the meeting to be very informative. He also met with the Otero County Health Department concerning the COVID-19 pandemic.

With no further business, the board adjourned the meeting.

Jury Trials to Resume in the 16th Judicial District

The 16th Judicial District would like to take this opportunity to inform residents within the district that it is the intention of the courts to resume jury trials in August of 2020. In partnership with Public Health and legal stakeholders, a Jury Operations Committee is in the planning phases for resuming jury trials in Otero County in August 2020, and Bent and Crowley Counties in October 2020. The Jury Operations Committee's primary focus has been public safety for citizens summoned for jury service, witnesses, victims, law enforcement, media, attorneys, defendants, court personnel, and the observing public. These considerations include strict adherence to social distancing, proper sanitation, the wearing of face coverings, and the mitigation of exposure risk in all areas at all times during the proceedings. No plan will be implemented without approval from the local Public Health Department. Proper screening procedures will be implemented upon entry into the courthouses.

The trial courts are a pillar of our system and exist to ensure justice is upheld and constitutional rights are protected. Obstacles presented by COVID-19 have made it difficult for the courts and other functions of government to operate in a sufficient manner. Despite these obstacles, it is incumbent upon us to find a way to safely resume jury trials. The courts understand and share in the health and safety concerns of citizens and will take great care to develop a comprehensive plan that takes into consideration all perspectives and risk factors.
